    - Best managed under regional framework
  - Key assets
    - Salmon Creek treatment plant
    - Ridgefield treatment plant
    - Major pipelines/pump stations

  - Clark County Public Works

  - All four agencies recognized for working cooperatively
  - Partners more effectively use consolidated sewer capacity and share costs for future expansions

# **Facility Overview**

- Introduction to SCTP
  - o Originally built in mid 1970s
  - 4 phases of expansion in past 40 years
  - Capacity today is approximately 15 million gallons per day (MGD)
  - Serves over 100,000 residences in greater Clark County
  - Future expansions planned to serve population up to 250,000





#### **Facility Overview**

- Operating Permits
  - Washington Department of Ecology
  - Washington Department of Natural Resources
  - Southwest Clean Air Agency
- Compliance History
  - 100% Compliance Award for past 10 years




# Salmon Creek Treatment Plant



## **Facility History**

- Original Construction
  - Mid 1970s 2.0 MGD
- 4 Major Past Expansions
  - Late 1980s Phase 1 3.1 MGD
  - Early 1990s Phase 2 5.6 MGD
  - Late 1990s Phase 3 10.3 MGD







#### **Current Facilities**

- Operational Highlights
  - 。 Staffing: 1 shift daily, 7 days per week
    - 6:00 am to 4:30 pm
  - Operations: 24/7 treatment operations
  - $_{\circ}$  Seasonal cycles increased activities
    - Biosolids hauling July through September
      - Increased truck traffic and noise
    - Summer warmer weather
      - Occasional odors from plant
      - Salmon Creek greenway natural exposure of decaying material causes natural odors (not related to plant operations)
